Women's Name            Amelia Earhart

Date of Birth (and death if it applies)    1897-1939

**\*\* Requirement: 8-10 significant life events**

#1 1908 - Amelia saw her first airplane
#2 1920 - Amelia took her first flight in an airplane. She paid \$1 for her ticket and it was only a 10 minute flight!
#3 1921 - Amelia began taking flying lessons and bought her first plane
#4 1923 - Amelia earned an international pilot's license. She was the 16th woman to be issued this type of license.
#5 1928 - Amelia Earhart became the first woman to fly across the Atlantic Ocean, and the first woman to fly across North America.
#6 1929 - Amelia helped found the <b>Ninety-Nines</b> , an organization for women pilots.

1931 - Amelia Earhart married George Putnam, a publicist and one of the sponsors of her first flight in 1928.

#8

1935 - Amelia flew solo from Hawaii to California. She was the first person to fly that route solo and she used a two-way radio on that flight. She also became a consultant at Purdue University in Indiana, focusing on aeronautic careers for women

May 21, 1937 - Amelia started her LAST flight of her life. She took off from California.

She wrote 2 books. She also wrote many newspaper and magazine articles and gave lectures.

When she started college she wanted to become a doctor and was in a pre-med program at Columbia University in New York.
